# **Redevelopment Updates**

## **Creighton Court**

In December, we closed on the first phase of vertical construction for Creighton Court in partnership with The Community Builders

#### THECOMMUNITY Builders

(TCB) and the City of Richmond. We are moving forward with the construction of the initial 68 affordable housing units, 21

of which will be Project Based Voucher (PBV) units for Creighton families. After the first 68 units are constructed over the next 18 months, an additional 72 units will follow.
